What we will be learning about this term in Maths and English.

In **English** lessons this half term, children will be writing Non Chronological reports and creating fact files about animal migration. We will be learning about animal migration in Africa and around the world. Please help your child at home to find interesting facts about these animals to help them with their writing.

Each week children will also have a grammar and spelling lesson. In Year 5 we expect the children to achieve at least 80% in their weekly spelling tests so it is important that the children have the opportunity to practise their spellings at home.



In **Mathematics** this half term, children will be learning how to solve problems involving fractions, percentages and decimals. Please practise times table multiplication and division facts with your child as it is extremely important that they are confident in this area. Please ensure your children are using their mental maths skills effectively in everyday contexts e.g. calculating money when shopping, telling the time and finding the differences in timetables, converting units of measurement when cooking or travelling.





In our Copthorne Curriculum lessons, we will be continuing with our current topic 'Arabian Nights'. We will focus on the impact of the House of Wisdom on the Early Islamic Empire.


Remember there's always a possibility you could be one of the top 10 world Mathletes and earn your position on the leader board.
