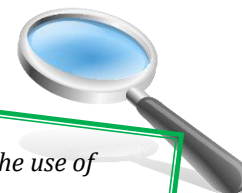
Areas of Learning



As Historians we will be studying the lives of significant historical figures such as Florence Nightingale and Mary Seacole.

As geographers we will develop our abilities to understand and create maps by studying Florence Nightingale's travel route. We will also compare geographical features of Bradford, England and Egypt: one of the places Florence visited.

As scientists we will learn about the use of everyday materials and consider their properties.



In Art we will be creating portraits of Florence Nightingale. We will draw upon Picasso's technique of using warm and cool colours to reflect emotions. We will use colour to express our interpretation of how Florence felt during the war.

In ICT we are learning about how to stay safe when using the internet and we are developing our skills using digital media to present our learning.

In PSHE we will explore new beginnings by examining the importance of friendship and what it means to be a good friend.

During PE we will master basic movements including running, jumping, throwing, and catching, as well as developing balance, agility, and co-ordination. We will cultivate our skills in gymnastics and football.

In Design and Technology we will continue to develop practical life skills. We will be baking biscuits that may have been eaten in the Crimean War!
